## Hockey Canada Development Programs NCCP Certification Maintenance



### Certification Maintenance

The certification maintenance requirements began in January of 2015 in which a coach has 5 years to obtain a certain number of credits in order to maintain certification.

#### 9.2 Policy Statement

- 9.2.1 Certification within the NCCP shall be valid for maximum period of 5 years
- 9.2.2 The concept of “life-span of NCCP certification” shall apply to coaches who:
  - A. Are already certified and according to the standards of the Levels-NCCP
  - B. Are certified according to the standards of the levels-NCCP while it is still in effect
  - C. Are certified according to the standards of an NCCP context’s core certification and gradations
- 9.2.3 Maintenance of certification must be based on active coaching and professional development

#### 10.2 Policy Statement

- 10.2.1 Professional development is required for coaches to renew “certified” status in any context or graduation
- 10.2.2 Professional development requirements must be completed by the end of the period for which the certification is valid
- 10.2.3 A national Sport Organization has the option to require coaches to complete professional development to renew “Trained” status
- 10.2.4 Coaches are required to obtain a minimum number of professional Development credits, dependent upon the context in which they are certified and the NSO-determined period within which they must renew their certification.

**OHF High Performance 1 Policy**

All Head Coaches coaching Male Bantam 'AAA' (Minor and Major), Female Bantam 'AA', Male Midget 'AAA' (Minor or Major) , Female Midget 'AA' and Junior 'A' must be High Performance - 1 'Certified' according to the Hockey Canada policy by the 2015/16 season, 2016/17 season for Junior 'A'. It is recommended that all Assistant Coaches be a minimum Development 1 'Trained'.

**High Performance 1 Application Process**

HP1 applications can be found under the Coaches tab on the OHF website ([www.ohf.on.ca](http://www.ohf.on.ca)). Coaches will have the ability to rank in order what seminar they would like to attend. As we would like to be able to accommodate all requests, this may be difficult to do based on the number of coaches who require this certification.

Successful applicants will be notified and will be sent more information including payment instructions. The deadline to submit the online application form for the HP1 clinics is as follows:

- June Clinics - May 1, 2015
- July Clinic - June 1, 2015

The total registration fee is \$1000+ HST and includes lunch/snacks, all seminar materials, course work, written assignment evaluation, mentoring and practical field evaluation (in the Ontario Hockey Federation Area). Transportation and accommodation are the responsibility of the participant. Delegates must successfully complete the 3 phases of the NCCP High Performance 1 Certification:

- Phase 1 – All In Class Seminars
- Phase 2 – Written Assignment
- Phase 3 – Field Evaluation

#### Phase 1 – In Class Seminars -

### Phase 2 – Written Assignment

- Coaches will be required to submit a HP1 Written Assignment by a strict deadline to allow time for their Field Evaluation to take place in the 2015 - 2016 hockey season. All submission deadlines must be hit in order to guarantee for field evaluations to take place during the 2015 - 2016 season. **To meet the Hockey Canada mandated HP1 certification, written assignment should be completed by September 15, 2015 to guarantee a Field Evaluation in the 2015-16 Season.**
- A Mentor will be assigned to the Coach following the in-class seminars and will assist with direction and understanding. The Mentor will contact Coaches regularly to ensure progress and assignments are on schedules to meet the timeline.
- Written Assignments will be evaluated and coaches meeting expectations will be recommended for a Field Evaluation.
- Coaches who do not meet written assignment expectations will be given an opportunity to upgrade their assignment with the goal of meeting expectations.

### Phase 3 – Field Evaluation

- With successful completion of the written assignment, each coach will be assigned a Hockey Canada Certified HP1 Field Evaluator to complete the Field Evaluation. Field Evaluations must be completed during the 2015-16 season.
- Each Coach will receive the NCCP HP 1 Coach Candidate Procedure Manual, outlining the three major components of the Field Evaluation.
  - o Component 1 – Practice Observation, plus interviews
  - o Component 2 - Game Observation, plus interviews
  - o Component 3 – Program Management interviews
- Following successful Field Evaluation, the Coach will be NCCP High Performance 1 Certified.

If your Field Evaluation is out of the Ontario Hockey Federation Area, an additional fee may be required to have a Field Evaluator attend your field evaluation. With your application and acceptance to this High Performance 1 Seminar you acknowledge and agree to the additional expense required to be certified.
