NCCP Development 1 Certification Process

Revised NCCP for Hockey | Pathway

The following diagram illustrates the typical pathway that a coach would follow in the **Revised NCCP for Hockey**:



* Includes all pre-clinic, and in-clinic assignments

Significant change in the Revised NCCP for Hockey is the difference between 'Trained' and 'Certified' Status. In order for certification, the coach must demonstrate evidence of learning through the 'competency-based' evaluation process.

Evaluation Process to Complete Development 1 'Certified' Status

Once the coach has successfully attended and completed the pre-clinic, and in-clinic assignments, the coach retains a Development 1 **'Trained'** status. The requirements to become Development 1 **'Certified'** are successful completion of the following tasks:

- 1. Written Assignment NCCP Development 1 Coach Workbook, including the Emergency Action Plan (EAP)
- 2. MED Competition Introduction Online Evaluation <u>Click here for more information</u>
- 3. Field Evaluation Practice

*Coaches can be active on a roster with 'Trained' status for one season after attending a clinic.

Evaluation Process to Complete Development 1 'Certified' Status

- 1. Coaches must complete the MED online evaluation and Coach Workbook prior to requesting a Field Evaluation
- 2. Once both are completed, the Coach may request a Field Evaluation
- 3. Coaches should contact <u>Tyler Tolton</u> at the Alliance Hockey Office to request a field evaluation.
- 4. Coach must bring the following to the Field Evaluation (Practice):
 - a) Completed Coach Workbook
 - b) Completed Emergency Action Plan (EAP)





- c) Copy of Practice Plan to be executed during the Field Evaluation
- 5. Once Field Evaluation is completed, the Coach will be provided with a copy of the evaluation, debrief, and action plan documents.
- 6. Upon successful completion of field evaluation and all other requirements, the Coach's Hockey Canada Registry (HCR) profile and CAC Locker Transcript will be updated.
- Development 1 'Certified' Status is valid for 5 years. To maintain 'Certified' status, coaches are required to obtain 20 Professional Development (PD) points over that 5-year period. See <u>Hockey Canada Certification</u> <u>Maintenance</u> for more details.
