## The Glimmer of Gold!

A study by Jim Parcels – Province of Ontario Out of 360,000 kids born in 1968

**x** 32,000 went on to play minor hockey of some type

- x 223 were drafted by the Ontario Hockey League (Major Junior)
- **x** 65 were subsequently drafted to the NHL
- ★ 8 or an average of 1 out of 4,000 played 400 or more games in the NHL at the time of the study, and of those only 4 were still in the NHL.
