

# OHF to Introduce Modified-Ice Progression

# Review of Announcement

1. Game play for 2012-and-2013-born players (5-and-6-year-olds) in the 2018-2019 season is to be cross-ice.
2. Game play for 2011-born players (7-year-olds) in the 2018-2019 season is to be half-ice.
3. There are only two exceptions to this progression
  - I. 2011-born players who were granted the opportunity to play with 2010-born players in the 2017-2018 season may continue to play with the age group above for the 2018-2019 and 2019-2020 season; or,
  - II. if a minor hockey association makes a request to its Member to allow an exemption due to registration numbers and the Member approves the request.



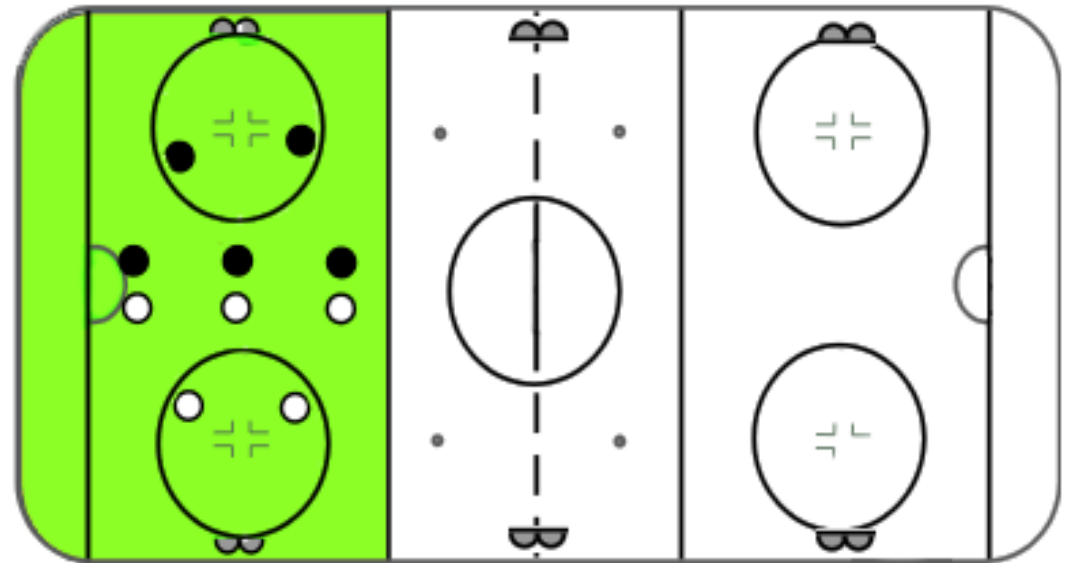
# Review of Announcement – Continued...

4. In instances where mixed programming (2010-and-2011 born players) is permitted by the Member for the 2018-2019 season, teams will start the season in half-ice programming and transition to full-ice for the second half. This will be repeated in 2019-2020 for 2011-born players.



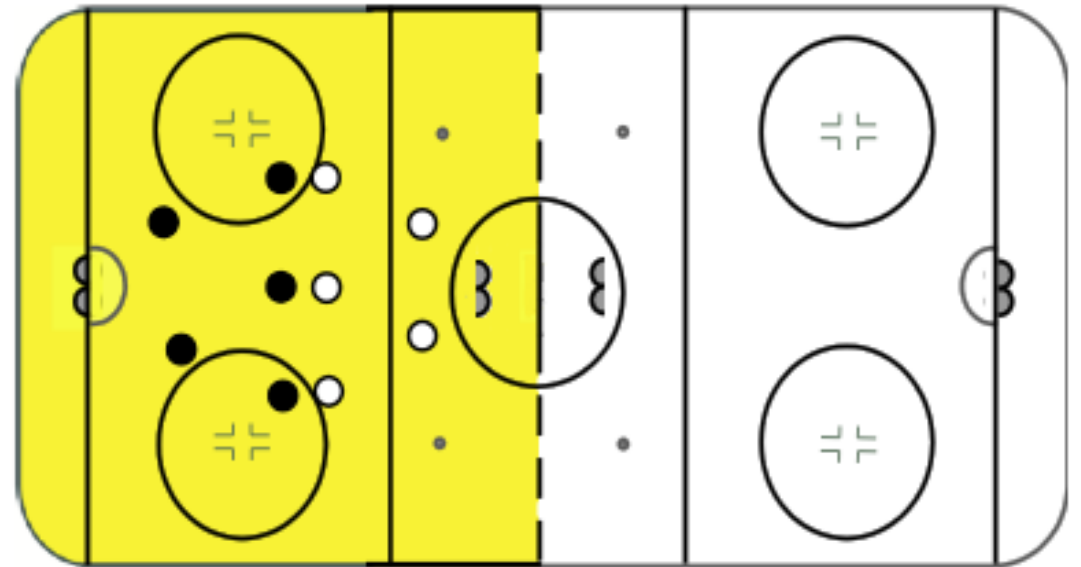
# Hockey Canada – Winter Congress Motions

- 6-year-old and under hockey games to be played cross ice or a modified ice surface that is similar in size to 100x60.
  - No officials
  - No designated goaltenders
  - No designated positions
  - Fulfills LTAD



# Hockey Canada – Winter Congress Motions

- 7-year-old hockey games to be played cross ice or half ice or modified ice to a maximum of 100x100.
  - One official
  - Designated goaltenders as option
  - No designated player positions
  - Fulfills LTAD



# Hockey Canada – Winter Congress Motions

- 8-year-old hockey games to be played cross ice, half ice or modified ice to a maximum of 100x100 from October to December.
  - One official
  - Designated goaltenders as option
  - No designated player positions
  - Fulfills LTAD
- Transition to Full Ice starting in January.
  - Use September as a Development month – no games, just practices.
  - Play a limited half-ice game schedule from October to December.
  - Use January as a development month (practices and exhibition games) to help transition kids to full ice with 2 exhibition games.
  - Full ice games February and March.
  - **Two officials, designated goaltenders (optional), no designated player positions, fulfills LTAD.**



# Hockey Canada – Winter Congress Motions

- For mixed programming there will be three options available to the Members to choose from:
  - Deliver ½ ice programming for the full year to players 7 and 8 years of age;
  - Deliver ½ ice programming for the full year to players 7 and 8 years of age and provide a 6 week transition program to the players that are 8 years of age in February and March; or
  - Deliver programming set out above for players 8 years of age for the mixed age group with the understanding that the players 7 years of age will repeat the programming as an 8-year-old.
